

Pat Summitt

There are few of us who don't recognize the name "Pat Summitt" and associate it with the words "excellence," "success," "character," and "leadership." Born Patricia Sue Head on June 14, 1952 in Clarksville, Tennessee, she gained fame as an All-American, playing basketball at The University of Tennessee at Martin. In the 1976 Montreal Olympics, she was co-captain of the U.S. national team, earning a silver medal in the first appearance of women's basketball as an Olympic sport. Only eight years later, she earned a gold medal as coach of the U.S. team in the 1984 Los Angeles Olympics.

Many of Pat's achievements center around her coaching of the University of Tennessee Lady Volunteers basketball team from 1974-2012. Her skilled leadership recruiting and on the court led her teams to an unsurpassed record of 1098 wins and an outstanding record of 16 SEC tournament titles, 20 consecutive NCAA tournament entries, 18 final four showings, and 8 national championships, including a perfect season in 1997-1998.

She earned many important awards and recognitions that reflected the great success

of her teams under her mentoring and leadership. She was 8-time SEC Coach of the Year and 7-time NCAA Coach of the Year. Her awards are too numerous to list here, but many were ground-breaking recognitions, including 1990 – International Women's Sports Hall of Fame, 1999 – Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, 2000 – Naismith Coach of the Century, 2009 – #11 in the *Sporting News* top 50 coaches (college and professional) of all time, 2012 – Presidential Medal of Freedom, and 2012 – Arthur Ashe Courage Award

In 2012, Pat retired as coach of the Lady Vols, and she was diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease, which took her from us on June 28, 2016. The "Pat Summitt Foundation," a nonprofit charitable organization that supports Alzheimer's research was established in her honor - <http://patsummitt.org>.

Each spring, **KnoxPEX** features a theme that highlights the ways in which postage stamps and their uses have illustrated important historical events.

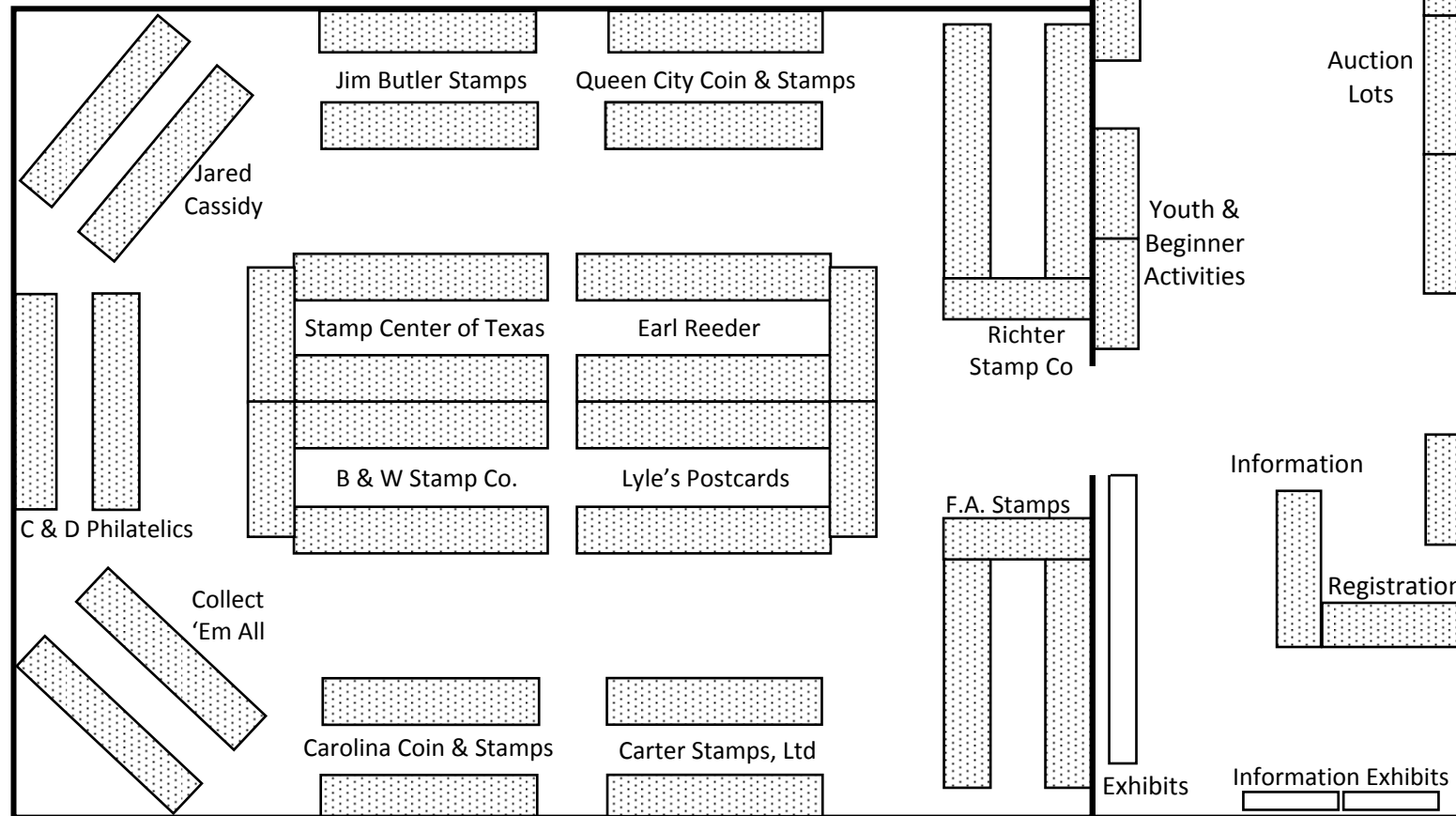
