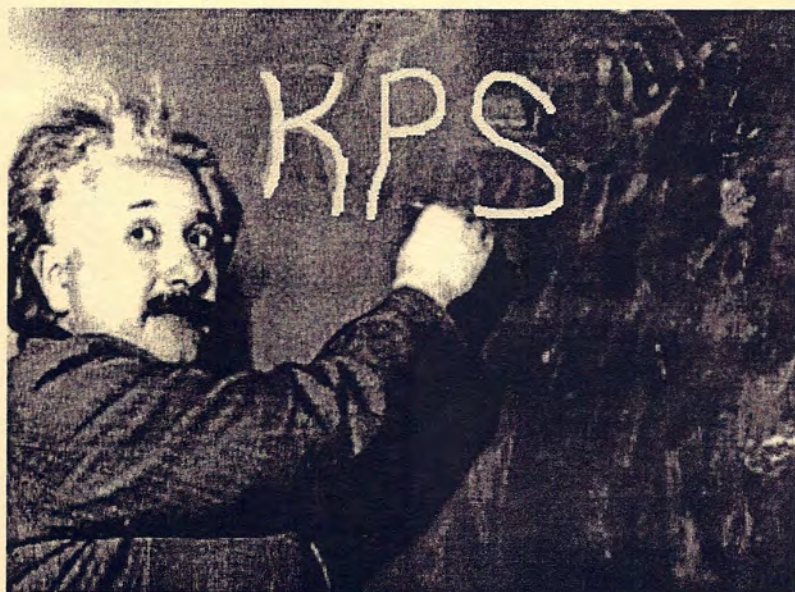
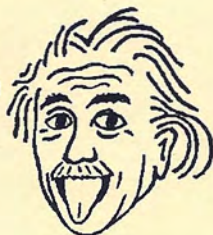

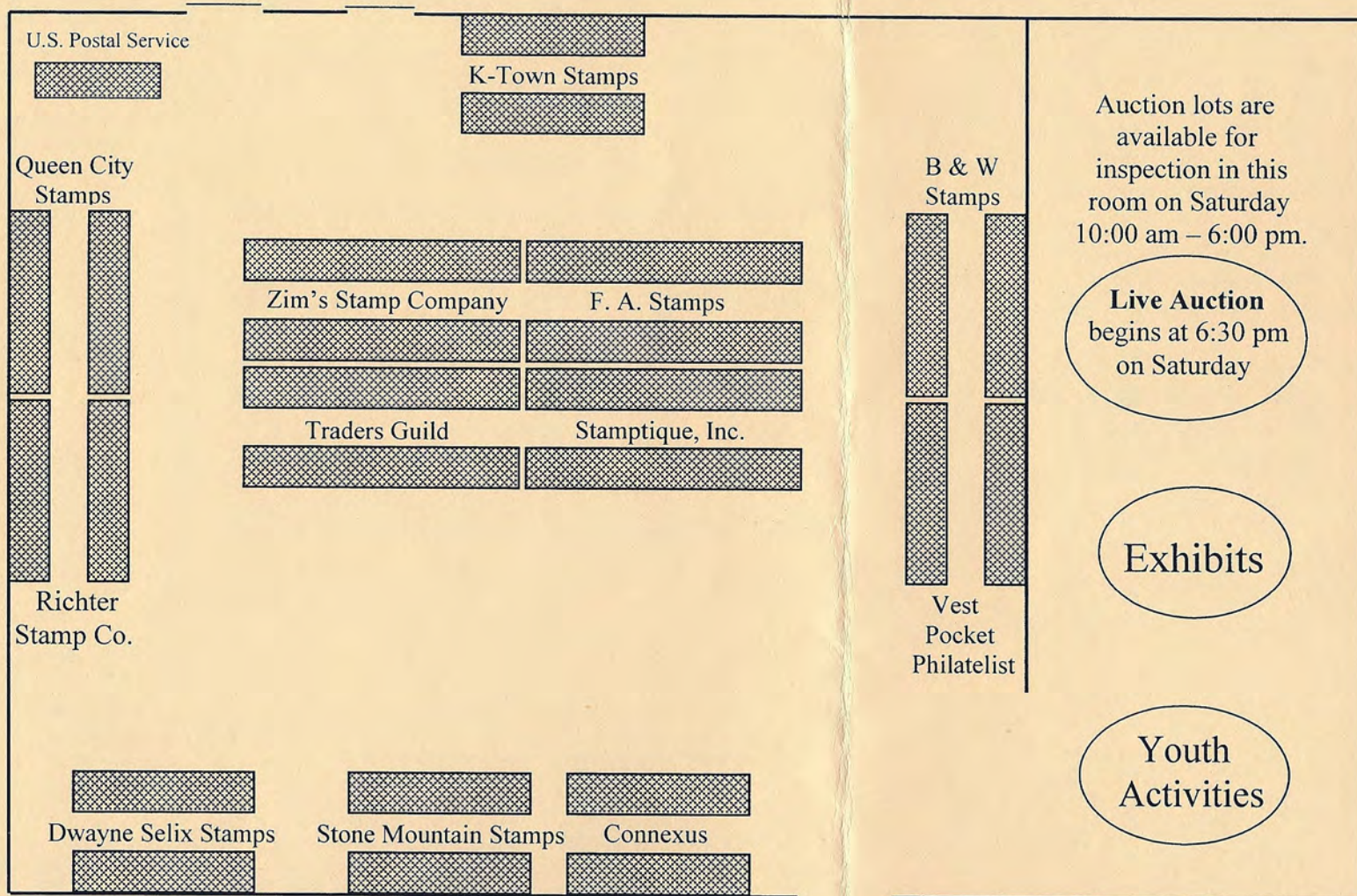

The 125th Anniversary of the Birth of Albert Einstein

Easily recognized as one of the intellectual giants of the Twentieth Century, Albert Einstein was born at Ulm, Germany on March 14, 1879. He began his education in Munich and in 1901 earning a diploma to teach physics and mathematics from the Swiss Federal Polytechnic School in Zurich and he completed his doctoral degree in 1905.

Einstein became a professor at Zurich in 1909 and at Prague in 1911, returning to become Professor of Theoretical Physics at Zurich in 1912. He was appointed Director of the Kaiser Wilhelm Institute and Professor at the University of Berlin in 1914, where he remained until 1933. He earned the Nobel Prize in Physics in 1921. Objecting to the policies of the National Socialist government, Einstein renounced his German citizenship and emigrated to the United States in 1933, where he held the position of Professor of Theoretical Physics at Princeton University until retiring in 1945.

Following World War II, Einstein was active in the World Government Movement. He was offered, but declined the Presidency of the State of Israel, but helped establish the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. He died at Princeton, New Jersey on April 18, 1955.

Albert Einstein is best known for his development of the "Theory of Relativity" – published principally between 1905 and 1916. He is best known for the equation, $E = mc^2$ – an expression of the relationship among energy, mass and velocity.

Albert Einstein has been featured on many stamps throughout the world, which have commemorated his important research in theoretical physics. The United States has honored him through an 8 cent definitive stamp (Scott 1285) issued in 1966 and a 15 cent commemorative stamp (Scott 1774) issued in 1979 in honor of the 100th anniversary of his birth.
